

A Westerner's approach to Chinese painting
Comparisons, East and West

Pairing works of art from East and West to clarify both their differences and points of contact.

Well versed in the History of Western Art, the lecturer does not attempt to see Chinese art from the point of view of the Chinese. Seeing it through a Westerner's eye may bring a fresh point of view to bear on hallowed masterpieces.

The Western paintings illustrated range from the XVth Century to the present day surrealist and abstract masters.

Differences

The classical tradition of the West is rooted in Greek art, its favorite subject matter the idealized beauty of the nude. As a result, the importance of man pervades the Western tradition.

The classical tradition of the East is more fittingly expressed by the unearthly shapes of Shang and Han bronzes, closer to surrealism than to realism. In Chinese art, man as such never reaches the dictatorial eminence he attains in Western art.

The realism of the West is achieved by strong contrasts between light and shade. This chiaroscuro modelling is somewhat repellent to the Eastern artist.

Oil painting, the usual medium of the West, expresses solid volumes with its thick impastos. The brush painting of the East admirably expresses space.

Resemblances

Once granted these basic differences, the following sets of slides illustrate how artists, East and West, have injected spiritual meanings throughout the sights of the physical world.

Some slides are paired because of a similarity of subject matter. Others may be of dissimilar subjects (i.e.: a figure painting and a landscape.) but reveal affinities of rhythm and composition.

The lecturer believes that differences due to cultural background and techniques are nearly negligible when faced with the coherence with which artists, both East and West, envision their task.
