

Art Exhibit Continues

The work of three members of Hawaii Painters and Sculptors will remain on view at Gi-ma's Art gallery. Artists are Adele Sommerfeld, Robert Drew and Tseng Yu-ho. A review follows of the work of Tseng Yu-ho.

Tseng Yu-ho is a native of China and a descendent of Tseng-tzu, disciple of Confucius, who did much to mould the concept of Chinese culture somewhere in the fourth century B. C. The young artist resides here, and is known as Mrs. Gustav Ecke. She is one of the most important living painters of modern China.

"Having completed her studies under Prince P'u Chin, a member of the imperial family, cognizant of the traditional ways of Chinese painting, without departing obviously from tradition, she has proved her scope and the strength of her personality as the sole living representative of the classical school; as differentiated from the academic as well as from the modernist.

"She has an international reputation, backed by one-man shows in London, Rome, New York, and another centers. The Honolulu Academy of Arts has just become the possessor of her first picture painted on a Hawaiian theme, on kapa, even, a full-color landscape of mountains, unifying with the ancestral Occidental qualities, subtle cubing or faceting of shapes reminiscent of Cezanne."—J.
