Zohmah Charlot: Interview on Chich`en Itza, Yucatan¹

1) How did Jean Charlot get Chich'en Itza job?

Not certain. It might have been through Frances Flynn Paine. After his work with the Ministry of Education ended, he probably needed a job. Paine was a good and life-long friend.

2) Did Charlot ever go back to Chich'en?

Yes, we went back the year Jean had his big show in Mexico City (March-April 28, 1968)

3) Do you have any memories of what Charot said about Chich'en.

He was amazed to see the changes when we looked again at all the places he'd stayed (back in 1924), on our '68 visit. The "Sacred Well," where they used to swim had *not* changed! He was upset by the big tourist hotels which had been built.

He'd worked three seasons there—in the hot sun—and ever after, was cold. Even the *warmest* Hawaiian weather had him in a sweater.
